1. Audit ourselves. The health of Professional associations & citizen groupings determine the health of a country.
2. Strengthen enforcement and compliance in administrative areas/measure that can be employed in day-to-day operations.
3. Reclaim the mass base. Secure spaces of dissent. We need intergenerational renewal and conversation.
4. Avoid “projectization” and “NGO-ing” all initiatives, and tailoring them for donor funding. It slows down progress.
5. More engagement with citizens.

- To encourage the faithful to actively step into governance roles, not as spectators but as principled leaders, serving as salt and light in society.

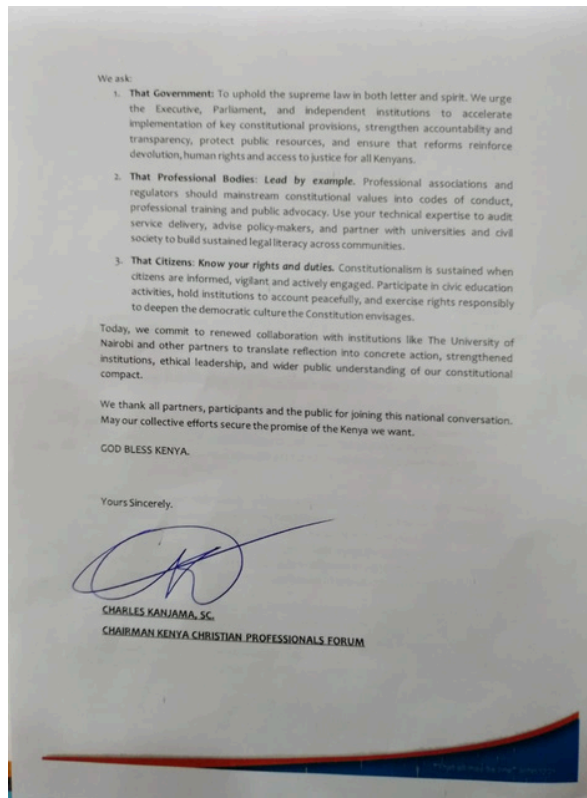
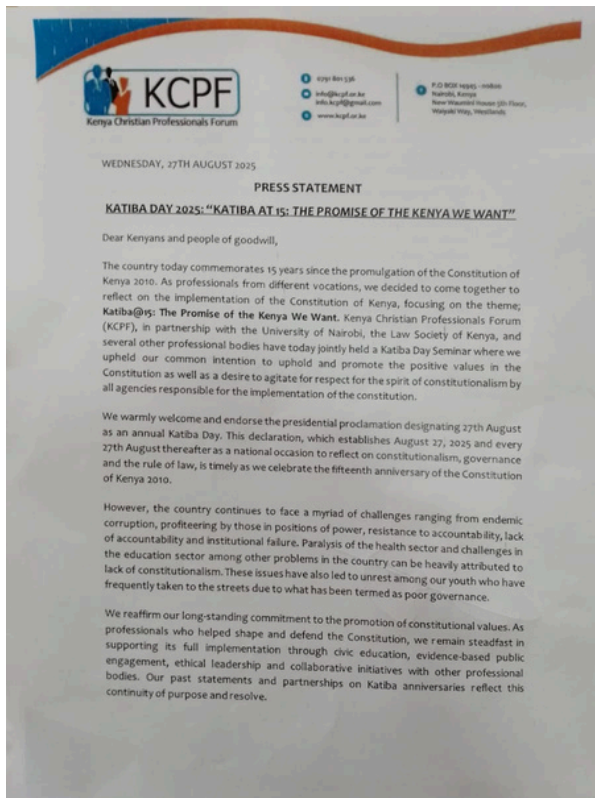

RE: REVOKE THE ROLL OUT OF THE SEX EDUCATION NOW!

We (the Kenya Christian Professionals Forum) are shocked to learn that the Cabinet Secretary (CS) for Education has announced the incorporation of sex education into the curriculum across all schools and grades. The Nation Media Group, on August 20, 2025, <https://rb.gy/bz6sh3>, reports that the CS for Education, Mr. Julius Migos Ogamba, while appearing before the National Assembly Committee on Implementation at Bunge Tower on August 19, 2025, announced that sex education has been incorporated into the curriculum following a motion by Kirinyaga Women Representative Jane Maina.

Research done in Kenya shows that the sex education referred to is actually the now impugned Comprehensive Sexuality Education (CSE) <https://tinyurl.com/lindaauha>. It is known that CSE promotes early and childhood sex debut, contraception, and other population control methods among teenagers. In Western Kenya, for example, after 8 hours of exposure to CSE content, secondary school students were found to be more suggestive of abortion, contraception, and sexual rights <https://tinyurl.com/24hvydb3>.

Globally, CSE is characterized by sexualizing children, teaching children how to consent to sex, promoting sexual pleasure among children, promoting contraception and abortion among children, referring children to abortion providers, undermining traditional values and beliefs, and undermining parents and parental rights. The CS and KICD intend to expose Kenyan children to content throughout the education curriculum, in all subjects, denying concerned parents the opportunity to opt their children out of this radical sexualizing content.

Sex education is a pertinent subject and should not be taught without parental knowledge and consent. Parents as primary educators only delegate to and trust schools to uphold moral teaching, not to undermine biblical principles or their authority at home. Parents have in the past raised an outcry against CSE because of its harm, and want to know what is the exact content that will be taught to the children at different levels. Why hasn't public participation been done to ensure that parents are agreeable to the content taught to the children?

By excluding parents and public participation, the CS and KICD seem to have relied on the UN inter-agency driven *International Technical Guidance on Sexuality (2018)*. This guidance holds that young people need sexuality information "as early and as comprehensively as possible..." (p. 35) and that sexuality encompasses "gender identity, sexual orientation, sexual intimacy and pleasure..." (p. 18). The UN interagency guidance is pushing pseudal rights, i.e. Sexual Rights among children. Sexual rights are non-existent in the negotiated and consensus-driven core international human rights instruments. States have highly contested sexual rights, and Kenya has a duty to restrain itself and to protect children from harmful practices, which CSE contains.

We therefore demand to see the curriculum designs and "developed matrices on sexuality" for the sex education that will be taught in every class or subject, and require that CSE implementation in Kenyan schools be halted until such conversations have been held with parents, religious leaders, and other stakeholders.

We urgently call on you, Education Cabinet Secretary Julius Migos Ogamba, to revoke the implementation of this sex education in schools as announced. Schools are about to reopen. If this harmful curriculum is rolled out, the damage to our children will be irreversible. It is a gamble we cannot accept. We cannot allow children to be sexualized or have their faith undermined by state-approved curriculum. The risk is simply too high.

The Ministry of Education should harmonize its interventions with two relevant policies in other government dockets, the **Family Promotion and Protection Policy 2023** and the **National Reproductive Health Policy 2022-2032**.

We speak with one voice for all Kenyans of goodwill, parents, and religious organizations on this matter. As KCPF, we are open to having a dialogue with the Ministry of Education to be part of the solution for a better values-based education system.

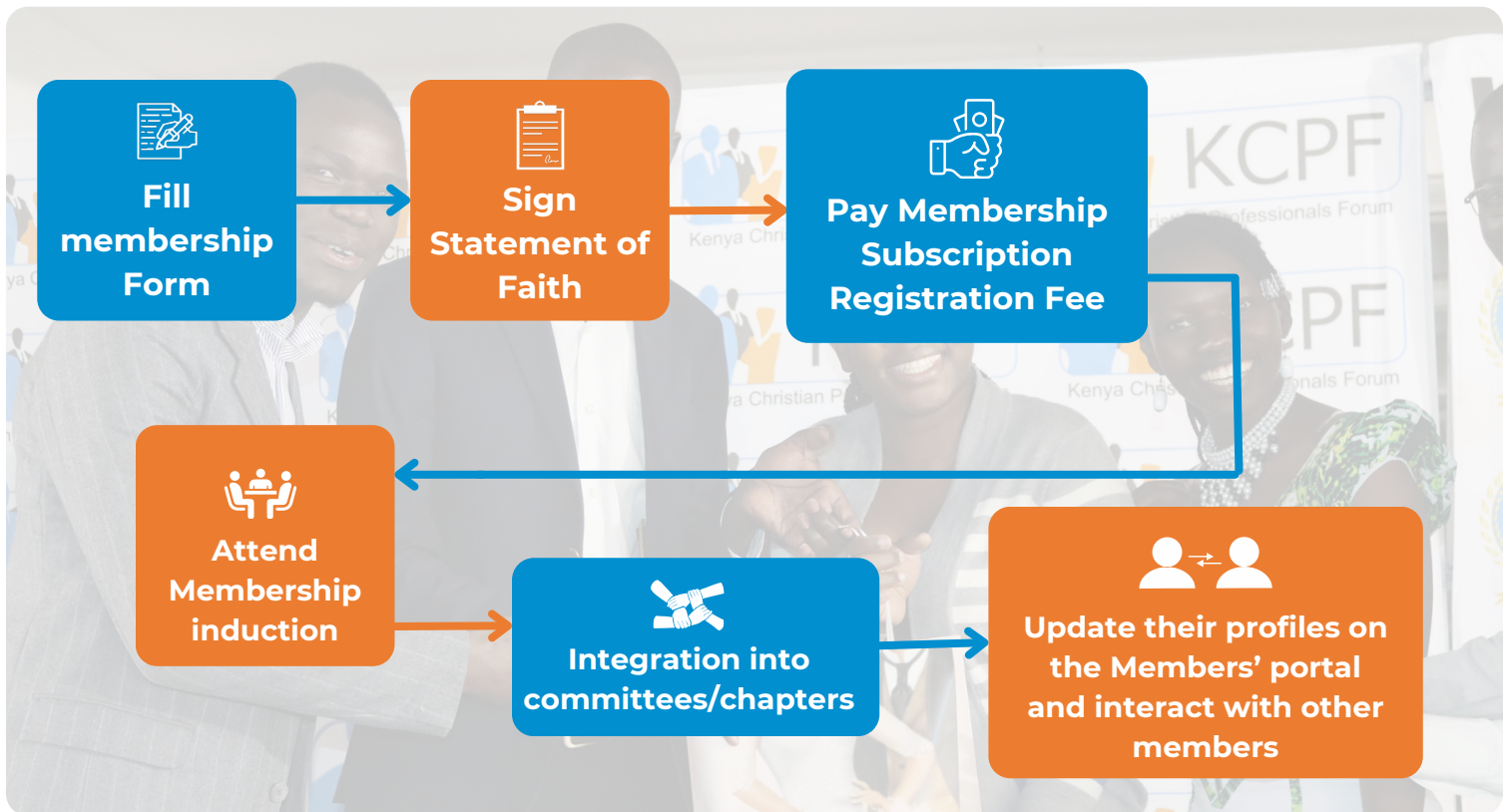
