Family Symposium 2026



The Family Symposium 2026, brought together Christian professionals, church leaders, and the community for a focused conversation on strengthening marriages and families. The event emphasized the **biblical foundation of family and marriage** as a God-ordained institution under attack by various social, cultural, and legal challenges in contemporary society.

Theme: *Building Great Marriages & Families.*



Key Themes and Insights

Marriage is God's institution, foundational to society and human flourishing.

Emphasis on family as the natural and fundamental unit of society, deserving protection and support by the state.

Challenges Facing Families Today

1. **Growing dysfunction** in Kenyan families, with over 80% considered dysfunctional.

2. **Infidelity** is a major threat, with estimates that up to 70% of men and nearly 30% of women engage in extramarital relationships.

3. Rising **acceptance of polygamy** among men, posing theological and societal challenges within Christian communities.

4. **Societal pressures** including economic hardship and cultural shifts undermine marriage stability.

5. **Children are increasingly questioning the value of marriage** based on the observed family dynamics.

Family Symposium 2026



An average of 38% of Kenyan households are female-led, often due to absent fathers. Dysfunctional homes produce challenges including youth behavioral issues, broken relationships, and societal instability. Dysfunctional family patterns often perpetuate due to unresolved personal and intergenerational traumas.



Foundations of Building Great Marriages and Families

Speaker: *Dr. Stanley Mukolwe, Founder of Raising Future Parents.*



Definition of a Great Family

- Rooted in **unity and togetherness** (Psalm 133, Amos 3:3).
- Families and marriages **require people reconciled to God and each other.**
- Individuals must **address internal conflicts** to contribute positively to the marriage/family.

Foundation of Strong Families

- Jesus Christ is the **only true foundation** (1 Corinthians 3:10–11).
- Building on Christ requires **obedience and application** of His teachings.

Role of Builders

- Both God and individuals build the family — we must work diligently while relying on God's empowerment (Hebrews 3:4, Psalm 127).
- The building process involves personal effort and divine enablement working together (Philippians 2:12–13).

Most marriages today are treated as contracts rather than covenants, contributing to instability.

In a covenant, spouses support each other to fulfill their roles rather than seeking exits.

Role of Men in Building Families

Speaker: *Simon Mbevi, Founder of Transform Nations.*

Context and Challenges for Men in Kenya

- 72% of Kenyans report not having a good father figure; many experience fatherlessness or poor fathering.
- Fathers spend an average of 9 minutes daily with their children while mothers spend 32 minutes.
- Absent or uninvolved fathers correlate with negative societal outcomes including:
 - 71% high school dropout rates.
 - 70–85% of incarcerated youth from father-absent homes.
 - Increased teen pregnancy, runaways, sexual abuse risk, and youth suicide.
- Men face unemployment, mental health struggles, substance abuse, and societal withdrawal.
- Rise of identity crises among men and a longing for meaningful fatherhood.

Technology and social isolation hinder healthy family relations.

Biblical Mandate for Men

Men are called to be worshipers, managers of family resources, workers, keepers of God's word, helpers to their wives, and leaders of families (Genesis 2).

Role requires:

- *Leaving parents and establishing independent homes* (counter cultural overdependence).
- *Sacrificial leadership*, serving the family as Christ served the church.
- *Faithful love* expressing total commitment.
- *Patient learning* and understanding differences between spouses.

The Five P's of Fatherhood

Present - Physical and emotional presence with children over material gifts or provision.

Provision - Providing for needs, education, skill development, and future preparation.

Protector - Guarding children from harm—including technology, drugs and unhealthy influences.

Priest - Spiritual leadership and imparting values.

Prophet- Affirming identity and purpose, guiding children towards their God-given destiny.

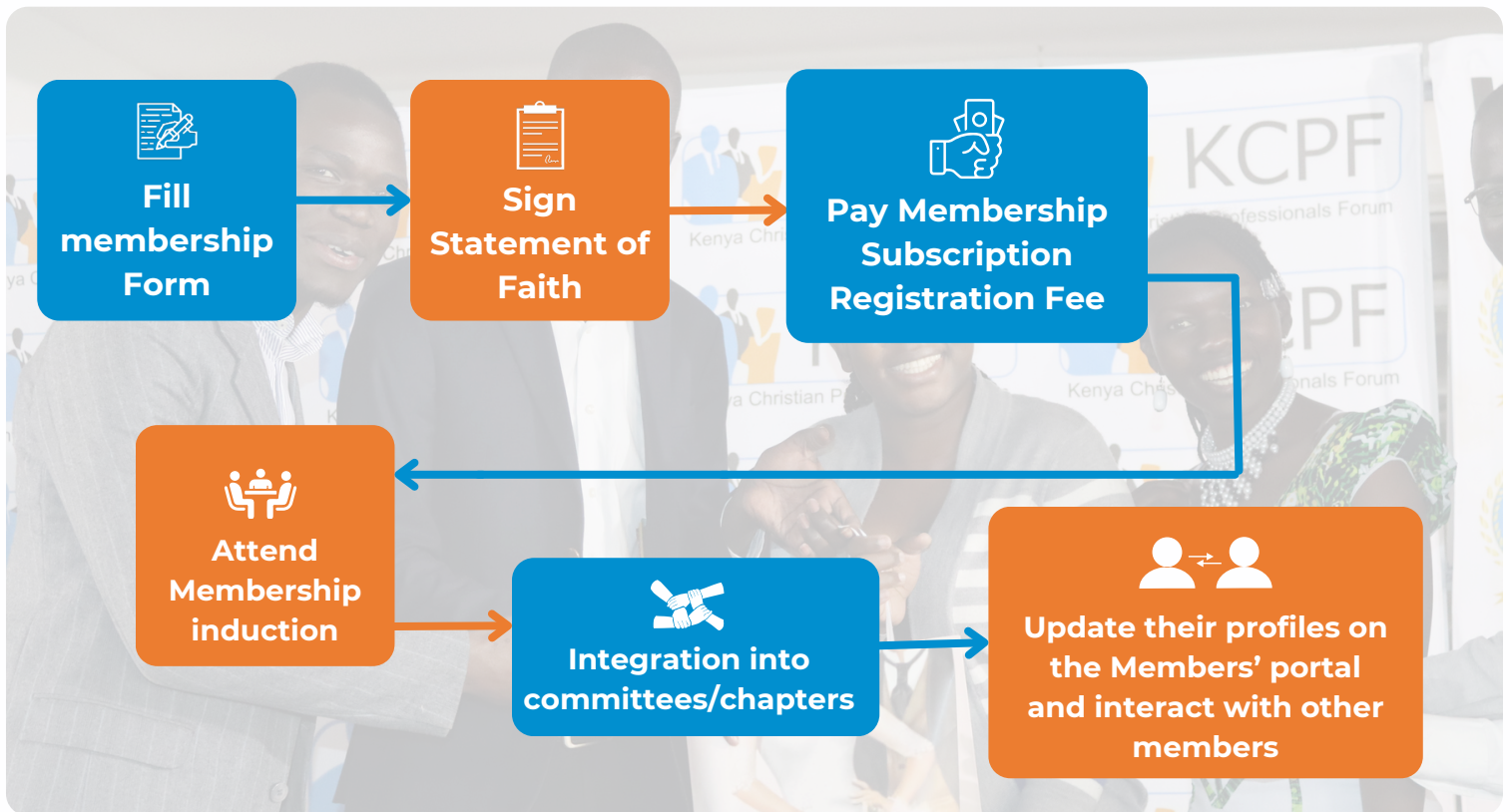
